### DIRECTIONS FROM THE NORTH TO UNIVERSITY OF STIRLING:

- € **M9 Junction 11** - At roundabout take 2<sup>nd</sup> exit (signposted Bridge of Allan).
- € **A9**. Follow road into Bridge of Allan, go straight through 2 mini-roundabouts, go through set of traffic lights, you will see the Royal Hotel on the left, keep on this road until you come to a roundabout (Airthrey Roundabout).
- € Turn left into the University.

### DIRECTIONS FROM THE SOUTH (EDINBURGH) TO UNIVERSITY OF STIRLING:

- € **M9 Junction 11** - At roundabout take 4<sup>th</sup> exit marked Bridge of Allan.
- € Follow road into Bridge of Allan, go straight through 2 mini-roundabouts, go through set of traffic lights, you will see the Royal Hotel on the left, keep on this road until you come to a roundabout (Airthrey Roundabout).
- € Turn left into the University.

### DIRECTIONS FROM THE SOUTH WEST (GLASGOW) TO UNIVERSITY OF STIRLING:

- € **M80 Junction 9** (A91/M9)  
Branch left (sign posted Stirling) .
- € **A91** End of Motorway (Junction with A91/A872/M9)  
STIRLING SERVICE AREA - At roundabout take 2nd exit for M9, Perth/Crianlarich (1<sup>st</sup> exit is Services).
- € **M9 Junction 11** (A84), At roundabout take 4<sup>th</sup> exit marked Bridge of Allan  
Follow road into Bridge of Allan, go straight through 2 mini-roundabouts, go through set of traffic lights, you will see the Royal Hotel on the left, keep on this road until you come to a roundabout (Airthrey Roundabout), the road into the University is on the left.

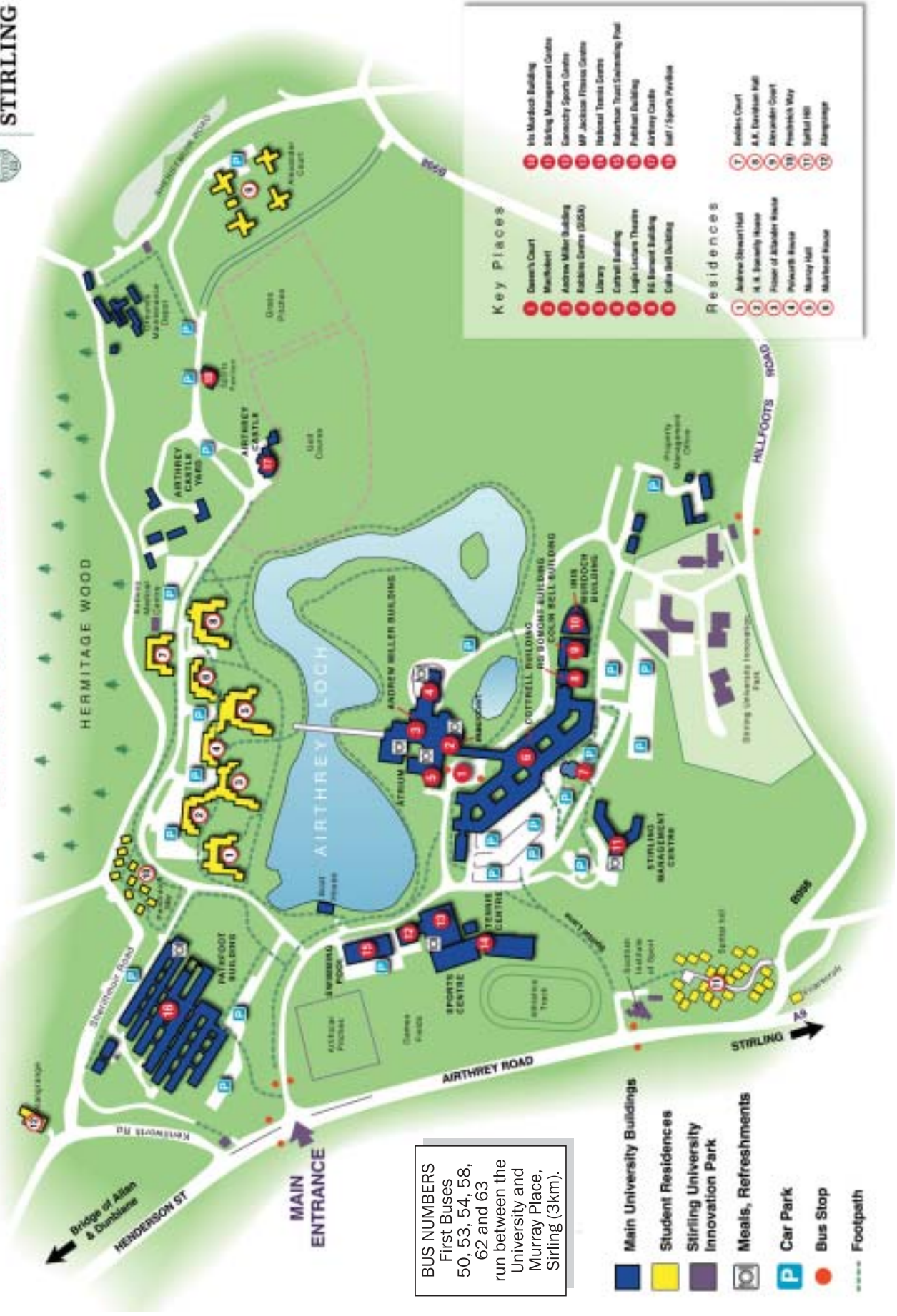

 Stirling (3km).

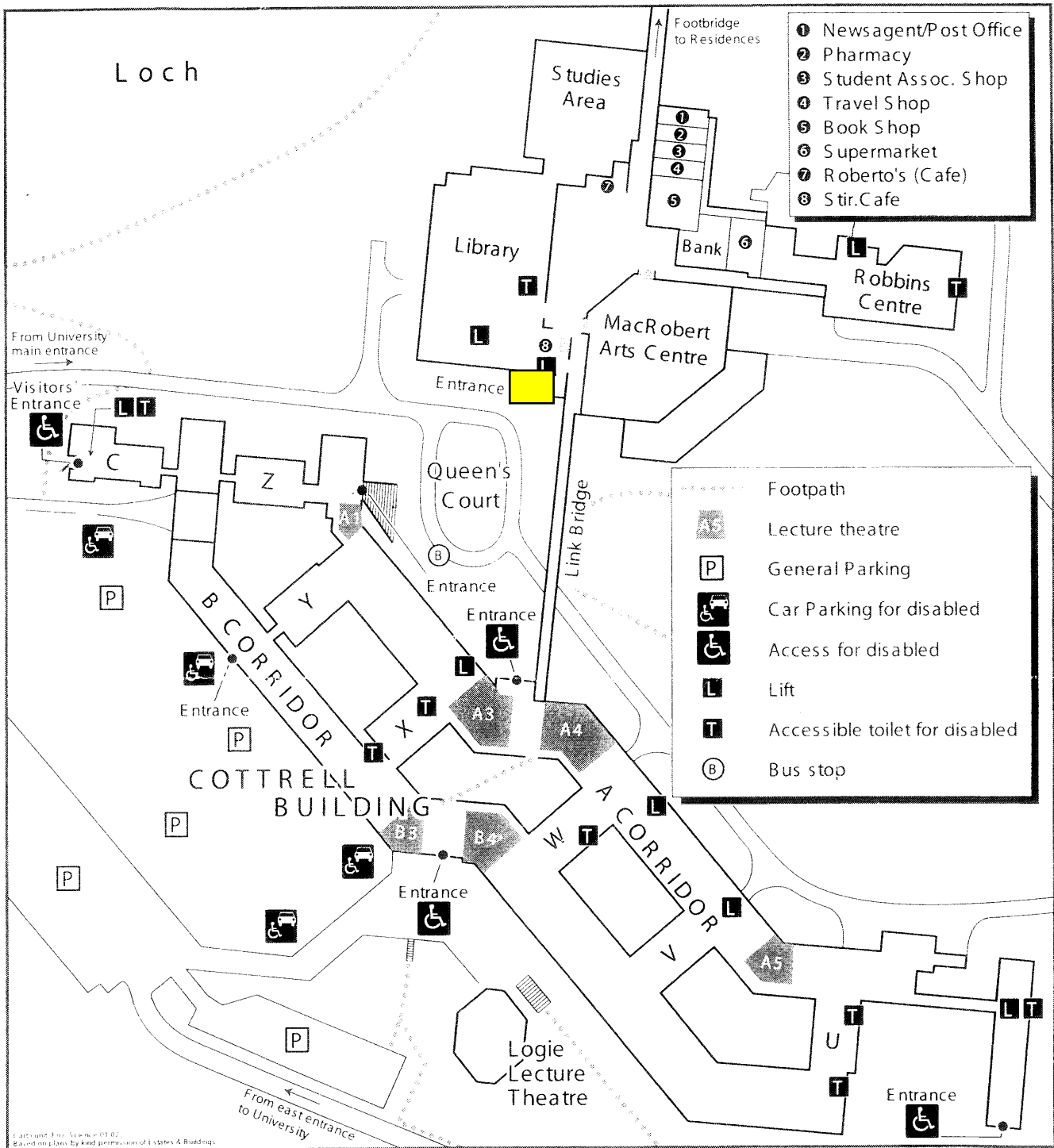
