

Occupational and Environmental Cancer Prevention

From research to policy to action at international, national and workplace levels

FRIDAY 25 APRIL 2008 ► University of Stirling, Scotland

This conference provides international, European, national and local perspectives on a major threat to public health: the toll taken by occupational and environmental cancers. It should inform, educate and involve those who attend.

The day will examine:

- ▶ the scale of the occupational and environmental cancer problem from the perspective of scientists, and international bodies such as the WHO, EASHW, EEA
- ▶ the current responses to such a problem from international and European agencies, from countries such as Finland which lead in the occupational and environmental cancer prevention field, non-governmental organisations (NGOs) and trade union bodies including BWI, IFJ, IMF, IUF and ETUI-HESA
- ▶ best available policies and practices to prevent these threats to public health, including presentations from leading researchers and commercial organisations on toxics use reduction, from members of such bodies as the Canadian Cancer Prevention Coalition and from trade unions and NGOs

There will be a range of stalls and posters at the event.

The conference should be highly relevant to politicians, policy-makers, trade unions (officials and members), community groups and NGOs, lawyers, industrial and commercial organisations and researchers.
